Family Promise of Skagit Valley has been serving unhoused families for 8 years alongside our invaluable church communities.


You are a vital part of housing and stabilizing families in our valley.

Churches partner with us through your prayers, volunteerism, shelter hosting, donations, and event sponsorships. Churches provide our organization with much needed funding and resources in order to provide our guests with the relationships and quality services that they need in order to make positive changes in their lives.

Current statistics show that there are over 600 homeless children of school age in Skagit Valley. This does not include children who haven't yet started school. There is a great need in our valley and we need your help to meet that need.

Working together we can continue to make a difference in our community. We are **EXTREMELY** grateful for the support we receive from our local churches.

Our Pressing Need

We are predicting a deficit for operating our shelter this year due to a reduction in participating churches. We are working on solutions (see pg 2). In the mean time we need your financial support.

Due to a reduction in church engagement we are needing to provide a minimum of one week a month to fill in gaps for the missing host church support. It takes approximately 90 staff hours to house our shelter guests for a week. We have 12 weeks a year that we need to use staff to support.

We are asking our church friends to help offset this cost to our operating budget.

This \$21,600 will help us keep up to 4 families off of the street or out of their cars for 12 weeks this year.

WHAT'S NEW IN 2023

Growing Church Engagement

We are working on restabilizing our shelter rotation model while recognizing that our partners are also working on restabilizing. Some of the ways that we are navigating back to a healthier normal is by regrowing our committees, finding new ways to reengage volunteers and by surveying those we work with.

We also recognize how much you are the backbone of all we do. We want to work on better communication with our partners through newsletters, trainings and more community event outreach.

One of the committees that we feel will greatly help get us back on track is our newly forming Community Engagement committee. We are currently looking for more volunteers to join us and share their expertise, ideas, energy and time, brainstorming new ways we can grow our rotation model and spread the word about the great services we are providing.

While we can't function without the money that pays for our staff and guests' services, we also can't operate without you.

Please help spread the word, join a committee, come to events and share your ideas with us. We are community strong and have become who we are today only because of the many ways you have helped grow us.

- 100+ families were diverted from shelter
- 26 families were served in shelter rotation.
- 21 families were served through seasonal shelter.
- 402 children were served
- 72 families were placed or maintained into permanent housing
- 30+ families can now be served at a time in programming
